Parent Code of Conduct

Members and Guests of Greenmount Cricket Club are required to abide by the provisions of this Code of Conduct and any subsequent updates as may be in force from time to time, and by their presence on club premises or at club events or activities are deemed to have accepted and to abide by the provisions of this Code and any other relevant Codes of Conduct, Rules or Regulations the Club has adopted.

- Remember that young people participate for pleasure – winning is only part of the fun. Help your child recognise enjoyment, not just results.
- Set a good example by recognising fair play and applauding the good performance of all.
- Encourage your child to learn the rules and play within them.
- Never punish or belittle a child for losing or making mistakes.
- Accept officials' judgments and do not argue with officials, team managers and coaches.
- When attending coaching sessions or matches, learn to distinguish between encouragement and instruction. Do not encroach onto training or playing areas.
- Support your child's involvement with encouragement, but do not give instructions to players, either verbal or non-verbal, once they are taking part in a coaching session or match.
- Do not make disparaging remarks about players or officials.
- Never force your child to take part in sport.
- Use correct and proper language at all times.
- Display control and respect towards all involved in cricket. This includes opponents, coaches, umpires, administrators, other parents and spectators. Encourage your child to do the same.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

Code of Conduct / Set of Rules for Young People

As a member of **Greenmount Cricket Club** you are expected to abide by the following junior code of conduct:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit – for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.

Parent/Player Information

Friday is Junior Practice Night.

6pm to 7.30pm.

Friday night practice is subject to the vagaries of the British climate and might sometimes be called off if the outfield is unsafe. If the Friday night practice is called off a message to that effect will be put on spond and our various social media platforms (Facebook, Instagram and Twitter) as well as on our website.

On occasion during the season we do have to cancel practice to allow for T20 matches, these are great evenings and suitable for all the family to watch some great cricket and socialise with other members.

Spond

We have previously had a number of ways in which we communicated within the junior section, but we are trying to consolidate this into a single place using the "Spond" app which you can download from the app store for Apple phones or Play Store for Android.

Spond is how we invite members to attend matches as well as general updates on special events like the T20's.

Playing in Matches, Kit and protection

Ideally children will wear the Greenmount Cricket shirt for matches

For U9's a box and gloves are essential
(and a bat of course) Helmets and pads are only needed for U11s and above.

Our vision for Greenmount is to be a family club and give every Junior member a chance to play match cricket as soon as possible but there are obviously some challenges to achieving this so here is how we attempt to keep everyone involved.

All Stars (<https://www.ecb.co.uk/play/all-stars>)

All Stars Cricket is the England and Wales Cricket Board's entry level participation programme, aimed at providing children aged five to eight with a great first experience in cricket.

For all boys and girls aged five to eight, eight 45 minute sessions held over eight weeks across May and June. The emphasis is on fun and being active with a focus on developing your child's movement skills.

Safe and fully accredited, valuable time with your kids – mums, dads, grandparents and guardians are an integral part of the session, with one adult supporting the child through a bulk of each session. Every child that is registered with the ECB will receive a backpack full of goodies.

Under 9s

(U9 is any child in Year 4 or below at school for boys and year 6 or below for girls)

We encourage all children to join from around the age of 6 years old – younger children are best trying our "All Stars" group. From ages 5-6 it is unlikely your child will be able to participate in matches as their skills needed to bowl, bat and field in a match won't be developed yet (but that's what we are here to help them with of course)

From around age 7 (Year 2) we will endeavour to get your child ready and invited to matches. How many matches will depend on the number of children we have each year, where possible we will look to run more than one team to give everyone a chance to play.

Under 11s

(U11 is any child in Year 5 or 6 at school for boys and years 5 - 8 for girls)

Under 11s cricket is played with a hardball (corky) and as such we cannot automatically allow children that join to play in U11 matches until we have assessed their ability at the Friday night practices.

As with U9s we want all juniors to play matches, the only challenge to this is if we feel that they are not at a suitable level of ability which will keep them safe.

Where this is the case, we will work with the junior to get them ready for matches and keep you informed on progress on Fridays.

Under 13s

(U13 is any child in Year 7 or 8 at school for boys and years 9 – 10 for girls)

At U13 and higher the game changes again, U13 cricket follows the full rules as senior cricket but with reduced overs and a maximum number of runs allowed before they have to retire.

We follow the same approach at U13s as we do at U11s, safety concerns will be the only reason your child cannot play but we will work hard to get them up to a suitable standard.

Final note

Whilst we try and include all players to play matches in their own age group, we will balance the teams based on ability as well - so some players may get more games than others if they excel.

This is a delicate balance of course; we want the teams to win games (not much fun losing every week) but not to the detriment of individuals.

This is a challenge for all clubs, and we do our best to get it right. If you have any concerns throughout the season, please come and speak to us.

Presentation Evening:

At the end of each season we have a presentation evening to recognise and reward the players from all age groups.

This is a great night and all players that have been in past years look forward to seeing who has won best batter, bowler, fielder and the much sought-after manager's award.

Winter Nets:

Unfortunately, the cricket season is short, so we do training sessions and sometimes competitions in the winter months to keep up the standards and prepare for the summer. These sessions vary in format year to year, so details are communicated when they start.

There will be an additional cost for winter nets, this will be communicated nearer the time as cost will be dependent on venue & number of children attending.

Get Involved:

As with all club level cricket Greenmount is run by volunteers, pretty much everyone involved has a child playing in one of the age groups. Without volunteers there is no club, so if you can spare any time to help out no matter how small please do, it will be greatly appreciated.
